Parent/Student/Teacher Conferences will be held on Thursday evening and Friday morning of this week. At that time we will discuss your child’s progress. **Please bring your child to the conference with you.**

Please be prompt for your scheduled time, because many of the conferences are scheduled one right after another. Thanks!

Reading: This week during Shared Reading time I will be reading My Lucky Day by Keiko Kasza. My Lucky Day is a fun fictional story about a pig, a fox, and the pig’s lucky day. The pig is lucky because he cleverly escapes being eaten by the fox. We will be working on the skill of cause and effect as well as reviewing plot, retelling, and recalling. Our sight/popcorn words will continue to be: are, that, do and the number words. Our phonemic awareness will be letter /L/ both its beginning and ending sound in words and grammar with a focus on the action parts of sentences.

Math: We will be comparing length in relation to longer and shorter, counting by 10’s to 100, and working with numbers 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16.

Religion: We are learning that we are part of the church and the more we learn about how we celebrate our faith as Catholics, the more we grow in our sense of belonging to the church.

Science: We will be studying about the heart in relation to how it works and how we can take care of our heart.

A special “Thank You” to Jackie Pagen-Kopf (Olivia’s Mom) for volunteering to help chaperone the fieldtrip to Lookout Ridge and for Bryan Pagenkopf (Olivia’s Dad) for reading stories to the class for Olivia’s “Apple of my Eye”.
